



GOLFING ETIQUETTE

Care of the Course

- Golf shoes with “*soft spikes*” **MUST** be worn.
- Players **MUST** carry sand buckets and repair all divot holes with sand.
- Bunkers **MUST** be raked. Please leave the rake in the middle of the bunker facing the direction of play.
- Pitch marks on greens **MUST** be repaired.
Buggies may be taken across greens. Buggies must be fitted with wide tyres during winter.
- White discs are for men's play. Red discs are for ladies play.

Play at Good Pace and Keep Up

- Players are requested to be ready 15 minutes before scheduled tee time.
- The lowest handicapped player is responsible for his group.
- Walk quickly between shots and call faster players through. Remember your position in the field is immediately behind the players in front, not merely in front of the players behind.
- Never mark your card when it is your turn to play. Be ready to play as soon as it's your turn.
- Keep practice swings to a minimum or eliminate them altogether.
- Lost Ball. If you hit a ball into an area where the ball may be difficult to find or out of bounds, always play a provisional ball from the same spot before you leave the position of the first ball.
- Aim to finish your round in 4 hours.
- Take steps to ensure that your play does not affect the safety of staff and other golfers on the course.
- Green staff have right of way. Proceed with caution.

Clubhouse

- Smoking is restricted to the patio of the clubhouse and only when people are not eating in your proximity.
- Consumption of refreshments in the clubhouse must be from a glass and **not** from bottles or cans.

Mobile Phones

- The use of mobile phones is prohibited on the course, the practice areas and in the clubhouse. Their use is permitted in lower front foyer, the pro shop and car park. (Some dispensation may be allowed for Corporate Days and other special events).

DRESS REGULATIONS

Standard of dress and general appearance will, at all times, determine the privilege of all Members and visitors to use the facilities of the Club.

Fashions change from time to time, but the principle is that clothes must be neat, clean and commensurate with that expected of a prestigious private golf club. The General Manager maintains the flexibility to alter these rules for special occasions.

The Committee will determine what is suitable attire and Committee Members, together with the General Manager, Club Professional and designated staff, will require compliance by a Member or visitor where appropriate.

Dress Standards ~ Men **Members Bar Lounge, Course and Practice Facilities**

Players are expected to be suitably dressed for golf in a shirt designed for golf. Shirts are normally tucked inside tailored trousers or shorts. Tailored shorts are traditionally knee length, either worn with long socks, or short white socks. All players must wear golf shoes with soft spikes.

- Shirts traditionally have collars, sleeves, and waists tucked in at all times. Skivvies with rolled collars are acceptable.
- Socks worn with shorts will be plain white of any length with an approved Golf Club logo or a discreet manufacturer's logo.

UNACCEPTABLE DRESS

- Football/Rugby style shirts or pullovers
 - Cord or elastic top pants
 - Jeans, denim, pants with studs
- Trousers must not be tucked inside socks
 - T-shirts or beach wear
 - Runners, thongs or sandals
- Shirts, pants, pullovers, jackets and hats displaying any advertising that is not directly related to golf. Discreet clothing manufacturers' logo excepted.
 - Black or coloured socks when worn with shorts
 - Hats or caps worn in the Clubhouse
 - Caps worn other than peak to the front

Clubhouse Dining Room and Lounge

Smart casual attire is acceptable providing it is commensurate with that expected of a prestigious private golf club. A tailored jacket and/or tie may be required in the Dining Room or Lounge on occasions as specified.
