WORLD No. 2 BLITZES THE RIVERSDALE COURSE

The world's No.2 ranked amateur golfer, 16-year-old New Zealander, Cecilia Cho, shot a course record 8-under 65 to top the leaderboard in today's second round of the Women's Riversdale Cup in Melbourne.

She shot seven birdies on the front nine to set up her round.

Three shots further back on 5-under is Cho's 13-year-old compatriot, Lydia Ko, the world's No.3 ranked women's golfer.

Riversdale Golf Club's Lee Park is third at 3-under.

In a remarkable display of concentration and skill, the two New Zealand girls put aside their own heartache for the trauma their countrymen are going through following the devastating Christchurch earthquake.

"We both left Christchurch for Melbourne the day before the earthquake hit after playing in the New Zealand Open Championship," Cecilia said.

"We feel very deeply for the suffering our country is going through."

The two teenagers also tied the 2011 Australian Women's Foursomes Championship at Riversdale last week with Korea's Lee Park and Su-Hyun Oh, who is aged 14 years. Both teams came home with 139.
